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Andrew Crane is the George R. Gardiner Professor of Business Ethics at the Schulich School of Buisness, York University, Toronto. His work focuses on the nature of corporate responsibility and the way in which issues of responsibility are constructed and communicated in and around organizations. His current research project is corporate citizenship and the changing roles and responsibilities of business, government and civil society.

He is the author or editor of eight books, including Business Ethics: Managing Corporate Citizenship and Sustainability in the Age of Globalization (3/e 2010), Corporations and Citizenship (2008), Oxford Handbook of Corporate Social Responsibility (2008), Corporate Social Responsibility: Readings and Cases in a Global Contest (2008) and Corporate Social Responsibility (2007). Recent work appeared in the Academy of Management Review, the Journal of Business Research, Organization Studies, the Journal of Business Ethics and Business Ethics Quarterly.

He holds a BSc from Warwick University and a PhD in Business Studies from Nottingham University. Previously, he was Professor of Business Ethics and Director of the MBA in CSR at Nottingham UniversityBusiness School, UK.
